GOOD REASONS TO VISIT

- A site with an impressive history and spectacular architecture.

The Benedictine abbey of Cluny was founded in 910 and extended its influence over the centuries throughout Europe thanks to the extraordinary scale of its church.

Explore the remains of the great 11th-century church, which was partly destroyed after the French Revolution, along with the many monastic buildings at the site, including the Galileo passage with its reliquaries and coin treasures, the 18th-century cloister, the chapterhouse, the 13th-century granary, the framework of which houses the capitals of the great church, the cellar, the Palais Jean de Bourbon and the museum of art and archaeology.

DID YOU KNOW...?

Archaeologists discovered a treasure trove of over 2,000 silver denarii, gold coins and a ring adorned with an ancient intaglio at the site in 2017.
